	The first permanent English settlement in North America was Jamestown. It was an

French & Indian War In the American colonies, Great Britain's desire to remain a world power resulted in

a conflict with the French known as the French and Indian War.

Proclamation of 1763 This Proclamation followed the French and Indian War and restricted the western

movement of settlers.

Stamp Act Great Britain imposed taxes, such as the Stamp Act, to raise necessary revenue to

pay the cost of the French and Indian War. It was a tax on legal papers and

newspapers

Boston Massacre Colonists in Boston were shot after taunting British soldiers.

Boston Tea Party Samuel Adams and Paul Revere led patriots in throwing tea into Boston Harbor to

protest tea taxes.

First Continental Delegates from all colonies except Georgia met to discuss problems with Great

Congress Britain and to promote independence.

Battles at Lexington These were the first armed conflicts of the Revolutionary War.

Battle of Bunker Hill This was the first major battle of the war.

Approval of the The colonies declared independence from Great Britain (July 4, 1776).

Articles of The Articles of Confederation was a constitution written during the American

Confederation Revolution to establish the powers of the new national government.

Battle of Saratoga This American victory was the turning point in the war.

Surrender at This was the colonial victory over forces of Lord Cornwallis that marked the end of

Yorktown the Revolutionary War.

Signing of the Treaty Great Britain recognized American independence in this treaty.

John Marshall John Marshall was born Sept. 24, 1755.
